

COASTERS or POT HOLDERS

Cutting for Coasters (4):

From fabric A cut 12 - 4 inch squares
fabric B cut 8 - 4 inch squares
batting cut 4 - 4 inch squares

Cutting for Pot Holders (2):

From fabric A cut 6 - 8 inch squares
fabric B cut 4 - 8 inch squares
batting cut 4 - 8 inch squares

CONSTRUCTION:

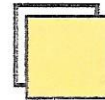
For Coasters take 8 squares for Fabric A and 8 squares from Fabric B and fold over with wrong sides together to form a triangle. Then press to form a nice sharp triangle.



Place a 4 inch square of batting on your table.



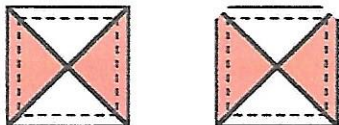
Then place one of your 4 inch squares from Fabric A facing up on top of your batting.



1. Next place one of your folded and pressed triangles on top of Fabric A with the raw edges pointing out. 2. Then take a folded triangle from Fabric B and place in the next corner of your square. 3. Place a folded triangle from Fabric A in the next corner. 4. Place your last triangle from Fabric B in the last corner, you will have to lift up the piece that you see of the first triangle and slide part of your last triangle under it.



Next stitch all the way around your sandwich using your quarter inch foot. Then trim off the corners and turn it inside out, pulling it through the center. You will need something to poke out the corners.



You will do this same process to make POT HOLDERS, just use larger pieces
